



All Souls' Saturdays

Each year, five Saturdays are specifically dedicated to praying for those who have died.

We begin on the Saturday before Meatfare Sunday, praying for those who await the Last Judgment proclaimed in the Gospel of Sunday's liturgy. On the Second, Third and Fourth Saturdays of the Great Fast, we remember the certainty of our own death and ongoing need for repentance. On the Saturday before Pentecost, we pray that the gift of life, poured out by the Holy Spirit, comes upon all who have died since Adam.

Prayer and fasting for the deceased is an act of charity that has been practiced since at least the 2nd century before Christ. Some of the prayers used in today's liturgies are found in the writings of the 4th century.

Incense is offered at specific moments of each Liturgy as a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the deceased (Leviticus 4:7).

The Liturgy of All Souls' Saturdays is offered for the dead of the parish. A Panachida service at the end of the Liturgy remembers each by name.

The first All Souls' Saturday of 2020 is February 15.
